Australia What is it like on the other side of the world? Australia is in the continent of Australasia/Oceania and England is in Europe. The South Pacific and Indian Ocean surround Australia. Seasons and the difference in time (zones) are opposite in Australia compared to England. The further away you get from the equator, the colder it gets. Famous places to visit in Australia are e.g. Great barrier reef, Sydney harbour, Bondi beach, Aires rock.	Kenya What is the same and what is different between the UK and Kenya?
